

## STATE OF THE CHURCH ADDRESS

Dear Friends in Christ at St. John's Lutheran Church,

My opening letter to this year's annual report comes in two parts. First, I will share with you a brief comment in reflection of the year now behind us. Next, I will offer my general outlook for the year ahead of us in God's grace.

With regard to 2022 at St. John's, this annual report itself is a testament to the work God has been accomplishing in our midst. I hope that as you read these statistics, financial statements, and various reports, you see how God has blessed us at St. John's in these concrete ways to grow in His Word, grow as a body of Christ, and show His love to the world around us. As I read through this report and consider some of the obstacles and potential set-backs we were given last year, especially our pastoral vacancy, and how we were able to continue with great vigor the work of the Lord and His mission to make disciples of all nations, I am reminded of the words of Lamentations 3:22-23:

The steadfast love of the LORD never ceases; His mercies never come to an end; they are new every morning; great is Your faithfulness.

Take a moment as you reflect on this report to thank God for what He continues to accomplish among us because of His love for us, and to recognize that it is only by His doing that any soul should receive or grow in faith among us.

In looking forward to 2023, I hope to continue to consider this first half of our year to be not a time of pastoral vacancy, but of ministry recalibration. I am excited this next year to explore on a deeper level what it means and looks like for all of us to work together as the one body of Christ. I am particularly inspired to do so from St. Paul's words in Romans 12:4-8, where he says:

For as in one body we have many members, and the members do not all have the same function, so we, though many, are one body in Christ, and individually members one of another. Having gifts that differ according to the grace given to us, let us use them: if prophecy, in proportion to our faith; if service, in our serving; the one who teaches, in his teaching; the one who exhorts, in his exhortation; the one who contributes, in generosity; the one who leads, with zeal; the one who does acts of mercy, with cheerfulness.

What this means for me is that in the year ahead I will be renewing a focus on what it means to devote all of my time and energy to the pastoral ministry at St. John's. What this means for you is that you will have unique opportunities to explore how you might function in the body of Christ in serving St. John's many other ministries of evangelism and mercy in new and impactful ways. In working together as the body of Christ in these ways we will have the opportunity to continue to let God shape us as His city set on a hill to which people might flock to receive His Word of life for generations to come.



## ST. JOHN'S/TRINITY PARTNERSHIP

One of the most significant undertakings of our Partnership with Trinity, Algona of this past year was our participation in both joint Partnership senior pastor and associate pastor call committees and voters' meetings. The process began with our decision to reshape our Partnership to be served jointly by one Partnership senior pastor and one Partnership associate pastor.

From there our Partnership call committee gathered names of pastors and conducted interviews for the senior pastor position, which resulted in Pastor Cowell being called as our Partnership senior pastor.

Next we continued the process for our Partnership associate pastor, which resulted in two pastors being called and declining our call. This left us at the beginning of 2023 with the decision to submit an application to the seminaries to receive a seminary graduate as our associate pastor. We are now waiting and praying that God would see fit to supply us a pastor through these means.



### FUNERAL POLICY ST. JOHN'S LUTHERAN CHURCH BURT, IOWA

In the event that the funeral of your loved one takes place at St John's Lutheran Church, one of the Funeral Committee: Ann Heyes, Jessica Parsons, Barb Harms, or Joan Peymann will contact the family on serving the lunch. If you are working with a funeral home, the funeral home will typically arrange these details on your behalf.

#### Meal Choices:

- 1. A noon meal of scalloped potatoes and ham, buns, salads, cake, coffee and drink.
- 2. A noon meal of Hamburger Hot Dish, bun, salads, cake, coffee and drink.
- 3. A noon meal of sandwiches, salads, cake, coffee and drink.
- 4. Afternoon lunch of sandwiches and cake or salads and cake, coffee and drink.

#### Meal/Services Information:

- The family will pay for the cost of the main dish.
- If you are working with a funeral home, they will take care of this expense for you as a part of your funeral planning package.
- The congregation will provide the salads, desserts, drinks, and tableware.
- The family is welcome to make a donation to the St. John's Funeral Committee to go toward purchasing supplies.
- The committee will contact members of St John's congregation to furnish salads and cakes as well as to serve at the funeral lunch.
- The ushers for the month at St. John's will help set up and take down the tables and chairs.
- The family is welcome to order a catered meal from a local restaurant or grocery store.
- If the family orders a catered meal, the committee will provide congregation members to serve the meal.


## **PASTOR JAMES MAY VISIT**



On Sunday, December 4,2022 Pastor James May, missionary with Lutherans in Africa came to inform us of his work in Africa. Since Lutherans in Africa started its work in 2010, it has been a growing ministry. Rev. May has more requests for seminars around the continent than he has time to schedule. Rev. May is serving more than a dozen countries in Africa. During his time there he has coordinated and helped build the campus from its inception and has worked out of a small compound in Karen, Kenya (just outside of Nairobi). Thanks to generous financial support LIA has been able to purchase a larger piece of land that will allow them to build a new Lutheran School of Theology that will not only be the home base for our missionaries to live but also to study in classrooms.

We all could see from the time he visited before the progress that has been done to the site.

With the skill and the hard work of the people, he has completed several building projects and now the students have a building to live and learn in. They are a self-sufficient place where they grow their own food and work together to spread the Gospel to all people.





Our yearly missionary money has been designated to go to Lutherans in Africa to help Pastor May and other missionaries with the work across Africa.

### **SUNDAY SCHOOL**

We began this fall finishing out Year C of our Sunday School curriculum. Our lessons began in Exodus with the Israelites in the desert. Time after time, God showed His faithfulness to the Israelites as He provided for all of their needs. Water from a rock, bread from Heaven, and miraculous victories over their enemies are just some of the ways He took care of His people.

We learned about the spies and how Rahab hid them from the people of Jericho. Marching around the city for 7 days, the Israelites followed God's directions and the walls "came tumbling down."

From the walls of Jericho we then followed the Bible readings to the New Testament and read about the birth of John the Baptist as well as his ministry. December brought us the Christmas story and incorporated the Flight to Egypt found in the book of Matthew.

It is hard to believe that half of the Sunday school year is already over but we look forward to learning more about our Savior in the New Year. We will continue in the book of Matthew as well as John where we will read about the Wise Men, Jesus' Baptism, the Sermon on the Mount along with several parables leading us into the Transfiguration of Christ and his death and resurrection at Easter.



It is our hope that as the teachers share their love for Christ and God's Word that the lessons they prepare and teach, open the hearts and minds of our students to the love God has shown to us through his Son Jesus Christ.

## CHILDREN'S CHRISTMAS PROGRAM

The Christmas story is so much more than just a story. It is the true account of the birth of a Savior for all people. Jesus was born as a human so He could fulfill the Law on our behalf and die as the perfect sacrifice for sin. Jesus is the true light that gives life to everyone. This year the kids from preschool through high school told the story of Christ's birth during the Children's Christmas program.

This year's program was called *LIGHT A CANDLE*. In God's word we hear about the Light that God promised to send His people. 
